## Audit documents Schuyler couple's misspending

The former treasurer and former fire chief of the Monterey Volunteer Fire Co. in Schuyler Coun$\$ 139,000$ of fire company money to help buy a Ford Mustang, make mortgage payments and pay for cameras, according to an audit report from the Office of the State Comptroller.

"The failure of the stewards of public funds, to safeguard company resources while allowing the treasurer to perform key financial duties with no oversight resulted in
the ongoing misappropriation of funds without detection," state auditors wrote in a report, released last week, that studied the fire department's financial information for Jan. 1 , 2007, to March 14, 2013. worth of spending that they determined was embezzled. ## Audit findings

Auditors found Kimberley States and Larry States took the money by the fire company's bank debit card and on the the fire company's credit with

States also wrote checks

made ATM withdrawals from the fire company's account, auditors wrote. Among other findings: " Larry States used the fire company's accounts to make sales tax-exempt purchases for his con-
tracting business. made some of those purchases with the fire com pany's debit card.

$\qquad$ Kimberley States resigned as treasurer in February 2012, she didn't give the fire company's books to her successor, as required by the bylaws. Payments she made from fire company supporting documentation. Some of the evidence auditors used had to be gathered by subpoena, because Kimberley States and an unidentified treasurer who served after uments auditors requested.

## Personal spending

The $\$ 113,311$ that auditors said was stolen in-
cluded $\$ 34,802$ that cluded $\$ 34,802$ that Kim partment stores, auditors said. Of that, $\$ 31,221$ was spent at Wal-Mart and Sam's Club for jewelry, computers, game consoles, cameras, men's and women's clothing, pre scriptions, groceries, a
treadmill and a microwave oven, they said.
Other funds the auditors deemed stolen included $\$ 21,233$ paid to Larry States and his DJ service and contracting business, bills not payable by the fire company, $\$ 12,077$ paid tire Kimberley States and $\$ 8,833$ in home mortgage payments.
Kimberley States told auditors that in 2011, Larry States asked her to ble to his business "under
Larry States chase aFord Mustang," auditors found. "Although the treasurer could not offire chief directing payments in this manner, she said it was not the only time it happened," audi-
ors wrote.
Some of the impropery spent money was used to buy Def Leppard conrentals for States family vacations and the purchase of various collect-

automated drawals for herself and for fire company busi ness, but auditors found no evidence that the mon no ev was used for fire company purposes.
Auditors also noted that many of those withdrawals coincided with other personal debit card cash deposits to the States' personal credit union account. Auditors also found that one check from Food

Bank of the Southern Tier payable to the fire company was deposited into the States' personal credit union account. An additional \$9,107 spent on hardware and lumber was listed among the $\$ 26,386$ that auditors said appeared to be personal, though they could not be sure. "Had the board taken the basic steps of requiring documentation to supreviewing banking records, these misappropriations over several years' time could have been pre vented," auditors wrote.

## What's next

The auditors said the fire company must write a plan that addresses the
findings and recommen90 days. 90 days.
James Pinkard, president of the Monterey Voltors that the fire company agrees with their findings and said the company has made some changes already, including adopting a code of ethics, canceling all credit and debit cards, account, tightening accountability protocols for checks, purchasing, building and equipment securi${ }^{\text {ty }}{ }_{\text {Mo }}$ More changes will be outlined in the department's plan, Pinkard "We stand ready to assist the authorities in the recovery of any missing
funds," Pinkard wrote.
