Ithaca Public Education Initiative has announced the winners of its latest round of Red and Gold Grants, which help support teacher-driven projects in the Ithaca school district.

A total of \$8,370 in grant funds were distributed for the 2013-14 year's fourth quarter.

Among the 18 projects:

• DeWitt Middle School teacher Pamela Engram will guide students in creating a map showing how the United States changed during the Civil War era.

• South Hill Elementary School teacher Steven Anderson will collaborate with art teacher Anna Goldsmith to lead his fifth grade class in painting a mural on an outside concrete wall of their school.

• Ithaca High School teacher Rebecca Gergely will pair senior students with Fall Creek Elementary first graders for reading partnerships.

• Beverly J. Martin School teachers Katie Dietrich and Catherine Currier will ask students to document their households through photography.

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• Lehman Alternative Community School teachers Jaana Grigorov and Gina Kolb will enable students who helped rebuild houses damaged by Hurricane Katrina share their experiences.

"I have witnessed firsthand the impact that a grant of \$500 can have on student engagement in the classroom," IPEI Executive Director Chris Sanchirico said in a statement. "The very generous support of our community makes it all happen."
